## President's Report – Joe DiTomaso

President made short presentation highlighting the new items to the meeting which included the meeting app, first public service award went to David Shaw, Grad student poster contest, \$12,000 award for IWSS meeting, new strategic plan for WSSA, Donn Shilling WSSA Fellow to NIFA, and finally USDA provided funding to WSSA for herbicide resistance education with this effort headed by David Shaw.

# Treasurer's Report – Ian Burke

We spent approximately \$680,000 this year. Income exceeded expenses by a significant amount. General fund and endowment fund made good interest over the course of the year.

#### **Endowment Fund** – Anita Dille

Goal is to arrange funds for undergraduate research funds. Endowment has almost doubled over the last couple of years. She named off quite a few members who donated \$100 or more.

### **Graduate Student Organization** – Kate Venner

Sixty-eight registered students at the meeting. Bayer sponsored luncheon on Tuesday, which included discussion with journal editors on publishing. Grad student workshop was conducted Wednesday on "Preparing for Careers in Weed Science" with several invited representatives from industry, academia, and government agencies.

#### **Publications** – Sarah Ward

It was Sarah Ward's first year as Director of Publications. IPSM is no longer subsidized by WSSA. Total journal revenue \$166,132. Impact factors WS 1.684, WT 1.141 and IPSM 0.838. Two special issues of Weed Science online only, including Research methods (now available) and Herbicide Resistance Summit II (available later this year). Herbicide Handbook came out in July. Printed 2000 copies and 900 have been sold by November. WSSA is in the black on the new Herbicide Handbook. Dr. Ward also discussed some of the turnover and workflow issues this past year.

## **EPA Subject Matter Expert** – Mike Barrett

Dr. Barrett reported that the EPA had a very busy year with a lot of shuffling of personnel. WSSA put in two pieces of advice on herbicide resistance management and monitoring for and mitigation of resistance associated with the new herbicide traits.

### WSSA Fellow to NIFA – Donn Shilling

Dr. Shilling said WSSA had big impacts in Washington with the 4 representatives from our society that are working with EPA and USDA. His goal is to increase funding for Weed Science that comes from NIFA. This can continue to diversify sources of funding for graduate students and funding for study of agro ecosystem with respect to weed management.
